Through the stories and statistics in this impact report, we hope to demonstrate how your support continues to benefit our future leaders who will move us to the highest levels of excellence.




Value of Endowment

# FUND FOR EXPERIENCE ONE MAKES MOTION CAPTURE RESEARCH POSSIBLE FOR UMW STUDENTS

Last fall, the University of Montana Western Foundation awarded the Department of Health and Human Performance financial support from the Fund for Experience One to purchase Innovision's Motion Capture Package for use in kinesiology courses at Montana Western. This innovative collection of technologies, often used in advanced scientific, private industry, and military research, represents the pinnacle of two-dimensional movement analysis and is used in a variety of medical assessments to predict and prevent injury and to assist in rehabilitation.
